Marching Band Dues

ALL FEES MUST BE PAID-IN-FULL TO ATTEND BAND CAMP

(FINAL Color Guard fee due July 29th) (FINAL Marching Member fee due by July 29th)

- Returning Members and New Members \$550
- Color Guard fees are \$650

Please note: Members that need New Marching Band Shoes, Additional \$40.00 for band shoes are required

Below you will find a suggested payment schedule. You may pay in full your marching band dues during registration night if you would like to. In order to have a drill spot in the competition marching band show, a total amount of \$275.00 for Wind Player and Percussion and a total amount of \$325.00 for color guard must be paid by May 20th. Again, all dues must be paid in full prior to Band Camp August 1st.

Suggested Pay Schedule for Wind Players (Brass and Woodwinds) and Percussion:

April 28th ~ \$100.00 Deposit May 20th ~ \$175.00 June 20th ~ \$137.50 July 20th ~\$137.50

Suggested Pay Schedule for Color Guard:

April 28th ~ \$100.00 Deposit May 20th ~ \$225.00 June 20th ~ \$162.50 July 20th ~\$162.50

Marching Band Event Procedures

- 1. All students must have their filled water jug, black music binder with page protectors, instruments, drill cards and baseball cap at all practices, events, and games.
- 2. Our practice and performance times will end on time, however students are expected to pack equipment up and clean the band room prior to leaving. Please allow additional time for students to help clean up and store equipment in the band room properly.
- 3. Parents are strongly encouraged to help load & unload the trailer after games on Friday!! All students are required to stay until all equipment is put away and trailer is unloaded.
- 4. Every Friday, students wear their Dunwoody Bands Shirt to show pride! On Home games, students will report to the band room at 7:30am to play mini pep rally on the "bridge" for students and faculty before the school day starts.
- 5. A fun DHS Bands tradition is for students to participate in the "Secret Pals" program. All students who wish to participate, will select a random member's name out of a hat at the beginning of the season. Every home game during the season, they will bring a special treat to their secret pal. On the last game, the students will reveal who their secret pal was.
- 6. It is imperative that all students are picked up within 30 minutes of dismissal. Everyone in the Remind text group will receive notifications on when events are over and students can be picked up. If parents cannot pick up their student within 30 min of dismissal, alternative transportation arrangements must be made.

Friday Game Day/Night Procedures:

- Students will leave after school & return at designated report times to Load Buses/ Equipment Trailer and head to Football Games
- Students will have a uniform and equipment inspection while standing in Attention. Leadership will check that all mandatory items are there. If students fail an inspection (they are missing an item) students are subjected to a variety of consequences based on infraction. (Ex no third quarter break, no halftime show participation, additional sectional practice time, etc.)
- Home Games are @ North Dekalb Stadium. Away game report times may vary. We will play the National Anthem before all Home games.
- After the Football Games, students will return to DHS to unload equipment and organize the band room. Each section is assigned "organization stations" and must complete prior to being dismissed.

- Parents must pick up students within 30 minutes of student dismissal.

Practice Day Procedures:

- Students will stay after school and report to the band room right after school dismissal for marching band practice. Students will fill water bottles, change into athletic clothes and shoes, gather equipment and head to the field to set up and get ready for practice.
- Practice will start promptly at 4:00pm every Tuesday and Thursday.
- Practice ends at 6:00 on Tuesdays and 6:30 on Thursdays. Once students return equipment to the band room, they are dismissed. Parents must pick up within 30 minutes of dismissal.
- Please refer to the attendance policy about Thursday practices. In addition, the "Friday Night Pep Band" members will join us for the last 30 minutes of practice to run through Pep Tunes for the game.

Competition Day Procedures

- Traditionally we will compete in two competitions per season. They are an all day Saturday event. Please refer to the band calendar for competition dates.
- Students will arrive at the high school in the morning with all items and equipment needed for the day. We will have a morning rehearsal prior to leaving for the competition.
- Traditionally, students like to have a big breakfast at the school prior to report time with their section. "Pot-luck Good Luck Breakfast" if you will!
- We will provide lunches for the students prior to the competition time. Students are encouraged to bring additional snacks or money to purchase food at the concession stands for their dinner break.
- After we perform, we will re-enter the stadium as spectators and watch the other amazing performances! Students can bring clothes to change into, blankets, snacks, comfy shoes, etc. It will be late October/Early November, so layers are encouraged!
- Students will always perform better with a crowd!! I strongly encourage 100% parent attendance at our competitions! You do not have to stay the entire day, but it will make a big difference in our performance if we hear the support from our parents and friends cheering us on! (We can even earn bonus points for General Effect if the crowds are cheering and enjoying our show!).
- Parents will be notified through Remind Text when we are returning. Because it is a very long day, please make sure students are picked up within 30 minutes of dismissal. Typically we will not return to the school until 11-11:30pm. Please make arrangements for transportation.

Uniform Policy

All Marching Band Uniforms must be worn correctly at all times, must be properly cared for and respected, must be properly hung back up after every event, and must be worn with pride.

While you are in uniform, you represent the Dunwoody High School Marching Band, our School and our Dunwoody Community. You will refrain from profanity and poor conduct while in uniform. You must also refrain from eating and drinking anything but water while in uniforms.

If any part of the uniform is damaged beyond normal wear, replacement fees will accure. These uniforms are only a year old and must be returned in excellent condition by the end of the season.

- Students will be required to provide their own black sleeveless shirts or tank tops to wear underneath their uniform for every event.
- Students will be required to wear their DHS Bands Baseball cap at every practice and performance, as it is a part of their "uniform".
- Prices above may vary from chart above depending on the company's current inventory list and shipping costs.

Uniform Policy - Color Guard

All Marching Band Color Guard uniforms must be worn correctly at all times, must be properly cared for and respected, must be properly hung back up after every event, and must be worn with pride.

While you are in uniform, you represent the Dunwoody High School Marching Band, our School and our Dunwoody Community. You will refrain from profanity and poor conduct while in uniform. You must also refrain from eating and drinking anything but water while in uniforms.

The color guard uniforms are custom made for each show theme and color guard member each season. You will be sized during band camp and uniforms will be ordered. You must have marching band dues paid in order to receive your color guard uniforms and perform in them.

Attendance Policy

Conscientious rehearsal attendance is always vital to the well-being of our program. As we put drill on the field and work to develop our competitive show, it is essential that all band members are present for the entirety of all rehearsals. Regular attendance at rehearsals as well as a solid ability to play the show music and march drill will ensure a position. Additionally, as we clean sets, we need all positions present in order to clean forms and intervals properly.

The following is the Dunwoody High School Band attendance policy.

- Rehearsal attendance is mandatory.
- Excused absences include illness (absence from school), death in the family, religious events (weddings, funerals, bar mitzvahs, confirmations) and major anniversaries are considered excused.
- Students may be excused from a portion of rehearsal to attend a private music lesson (1 hour).
- Students should fill out an ABSENCE FORM a minimum of 5 days prior to the absence and turn it into Ms.Caputo. https://forms.gle/djEzSpQonWfA13hb6
- A rehearsal missed due to work, other outside activities, or an absence not announced before the event will be considered unexcused.

- A student who misses a Thursday night rehearsal for any reason, excused or unexcused, can be held from performing the halftime show at the Friday night game. (They are expected to attend the game and perform in the stands.)
- Auxiliary members not performing are required to be in attendance to games.
- One unexcused absence or two consecutive excused absences may be grounds for removal from the marching band competition show.
- Consecutive unexcused absences may be grounds for not qualifying to earn a Varsity Letter.
- A student who misses any two rehearsals in each week, for any reason, will not perform at the Friday night game.

Mission The Dunwoody High School Band Boosters (DHSBB) strives to provide support for the band program at Dunwoody High School. The vision of the DHSBB is the successful academic and musical growth and outcome for all students.

Dunwoody High School Marching Band Volunteers

Family Volunteers are key to the success of our season! A variety of volunteer opportunities are available that vary in time commitment and type. We ask that each family commit to two (2) volunteer events per season. Below you will find various volunteer opportunities that we need help with.

Game Night Chaperone, Stands Committee, Field "Pit" Crew, Band Camp Crew, Uniforms Committee, Transportation Committee, Meal/Hospitality, Concert Committee, Special Events Committee, Fundraising Committee

Volunteer Opportunities

Game Night Chaperones

- Help ensure all students are on appropriate buses, using bus assignments and rosters
- Assist students as needed as they get their uniforms before games, and turning in uniforms after games
- Ride bus to and from games
- Help carry equipment and props as needed

Stands Committee

- Off-field support for marching band events (games and competitions)
- Distribute water and snacks while in the stands

- Manage misc. band supplies in the stands (e.g., coolers, sewing kit, first aid bags, stands supplies, medical forms, poncho bags, etc.)
- Coordinates chaperones for bus and stands

Field "Pit" Crew

- Coordinate on-field support for marching band events (games and competitions)
- Oversee loading and transport of podiums, props, and electronics to the stadium or trailer, before/after events
- Help students move equipment and instruments on/off the field for halftime show

Band Camp Crew

- Chaperones for our Band Camp week (a local day camp this year)
- Fun-filled, all expense-paid days at Band Camp, or work a ½ day and tag-team with another parent
- T-shirt included!
- Get to know the Band students and see the show evolve.
- If you can work remotely, you can bring your laptop and work from the sidelines, and just attend as you are needed (e.g., help with dinner, sick band members, etc.)

Uniforms Committee

- Measure/fit students with uniforms
- Establish effective method of issuing, collecting, transporting, and caring for uniforms, including band and auxiliary
- Keep accurate inventory of uniforms assignments for students
- Assist students in getting and returning marching band uniforms
- Arrange for cleaning of uniforms at least once per season, coordinating laundry drop off and pick up
- Assist director with coordinating / arranging purchase of new or replacement uniforms or uniform parts

Transportation / Trailer Towing

- Drive a truck large enough to pull DHS Band trailer to and from games and competitions
- Volunteers may drive a rental truck, if necessary (rental cost would be fully covered by the band)
- Check equipment of trailer before leaving school (wheels, reflective cones, spare tire with tool pouch, jack, small compressor to keep tires inflated)
- Help with carpools when necessary

Meal / Hospitality Committee

- Set up and serve meals and refreshments for band events
- Clean up after meal events

• Purchase and inventory supplies associated with band student meals (e.g., coolers, cutlery, paper products, serving trays, etc. (will be reimbursed)

Concert Committee

- Provides support for Concert Band events such as LGPE and concerts
- Work with Band Director to help create programs or other materials
- Assist with equipment such as chairs, music stands, podium
- Coordinate chaperones and other volunteers as needed

Special Events Committee

• Coordinate and support special events during the year, including Senior Night, Middle School Band Night, Spring Band Banquet, JanFest and Homecoming

Fundraising Committee

- Help with fundraising events throughout the year, such as car washes and Kroger
- Assist committee Chair in establishing/maintaining relationships with sponsors in the community

DHS Marching Band Member Expectations and Rules

GENERAL RULES

1.Students must abide by the DeKalb County Schools Student Code of Conduct, Dunwoody High School Student Rules, and the Dunwoody High School Band Handbook.

2.READ, SIGN AND UNDERSTAND THIS HANDBOOK. REFER TO IT THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. IT WILL BE UPDATED TO FIT OUR CHANGING BAND.

- 3. A serious disciplinary infraction may result in subsequent suspension from Band activities or removal from program.
- 4. No gum, food or drink is allowed in the band room, unless told otherwise by the director.

- 5. Always keep the band room or rehearsal area clean. If you see something on the floor, pick it up and put it in its proper place. Keep personal belongings, equipment, and instrument cases in the proper storage area.
- 6. Any instrument or equipment not belonging to or specifically assigned to you is strictly off limits. **DAMAGE TO EQUIPMENT WILL BE CHARGED TO THE INDIVIDUAL STUDENT.**
- 7. Do not go into the director's office without permission. Remember that the director is always available if you really need to talk.
- 9. During the regular school day, the band room is to be used for regular classes, rehearsals, sectionals, and pre-arranged help only. The area is off limits during lunch unless you are notified otherwise. For security reasons, the band facility is off limits to non-band students.
- 10. Represent the band well in your other classes and when interacting with the Dunwoody Community. Remember you are representing the band program and your parents, not just yourselves. Stay out of trouble. You cannot assist the band when you are involved with other school disciplinary actions or suspended.

EXPECTATIONS

Everyone must do his or her part and do it well. Failure to be able to do your part not only hurts the band, but also the progress of other members of the band. Individual responsibility is the key to a successful band program. Expectations come with membership in the Pride of Dunwoody High Marching Band; please know and understand what is expected of you:

- 1. Be on time for all band activities
- 2. Attend all rehearsals or performances
- 3. Be prepared for rehearsals and performances
- 4. Keep a positive attitude
- 5. Have all necessary equipment and/or accessories with you
- 6. Keep your instrument in working condition
- 7. Participate in fundraising events
- 8. Practice regularly at home (thirty minutes per day minimum)
- 9. Keep the band facility clean, neat and free of litter
- 10. Demonstrate PRIDE!!!!

Pride of Dunwoody High Leadership Team

Leadership tryouts will be held in the Spring to select members to fulfill the following leadership positions: Drum Major, Band Captain, Section Leaders, Brass Captain, Woodwind Captain, Librarian, and Social Event Coordinator. Below you will find the responsibilities and expectations for each position. For more information, contact Ms. Caputo.

Band Captain

- Model Band member of the Pride of Dunwoody High
- Embodies the Band Spirit
- Assist the Director with logistical and instructional tasks during marching season
- Enforces rules and maintains order during marching rehearsals and performances.
- Help plan regular leadership meetings
- Liaison between the band members and the director
- Works with Leadership Team to promote unity throughout band
- Makes announcements to the band as directed or when the need arises.
- Oversees section leaders during marching rehearsals.
- Sets up Marching Practice Field for rehearsal. Sound system, yard line markers, etc.
- Assists section leaders with uniform inspections. Keeps records of improper uniforms.
- Checks section leaders' attendance notebooks and reports absences to Drum Major.
- Reports any major problems to the director.

Drum Major

- Model Band member of the Pride of Dunwoody High for both marching and playing
- Primary conductor of the marching show and football tunes
- Enforces rules and maintains order during marching rehearsals and performances.
- Work with Band Captains to help plan regular leadership meetings
- Dedicated to score study and learning proper conducting techniques
- Prepared to conduct rehearsals and sectionals when needed
- Assist the Director with logistical and instructional tasks during marching season.
- Sets up Marching Practice Field for rehearsal. Sound system, yard line markers, etc.
- Takes attendance for every rehearsal and informs the Director.
- Reports any major problems to the director.
- Assists the Band Captain with uniform inspections
- Assists the band director in all ways possible.

Section Leader

• Enforces band rules and maintains order.

- Directs after-school section rehearsals.
- Remain a positive influence on the band and your section throughout the year
- Pass off your section on various memorization requirements throughout the marching season
- Is responsible for section's marching and playing performance on the field and behavior in the stands.
- Keeps a daily record of attendance in designated notebook and reports to Band Captains any absences.
- Inspects uniforms of section members.
- Attends all meetings called by the Band Captains or Band Director.
- Reports any problems to the Band Captains or Drum Majors.
- Assigns locker to all students in your section.
- Helps to keep the instrument storage room and field rehearsal area clean and organized.

Percussion Section Leader

All of the duties of section leaders, plus the following:

- Directs percussion rehearsals during the marching season.
- Is responsible for seeing that all percussion equipment is put in its proper place after each rehearsal and kept in an orderly manner.
- Make sure that all rehearsal sites are clean before leaving.
- Helps keep percussion areas in the band room clean and organized.
- Oversees the loading and unloading of all percussion equipment at all band functions.
- Keeps a record of all issued equipment and its condition.
- Reports any instrument damage to the band director immediately.
- Helps keep percussion equipment in the band room organized and clean.

Librarians

- 1. Keep music library neat and orderly.
- 2. File and copy music as needed.
- 3. Make up marching folders with music for all sections during the summer.
- 4. Aid in passing out new music and collecting and filing it at the end of the year

Social Event Coordinator

- 1. Works with Band Captains and Ms.Caputo to organize social events for recruitment, leadership team building events, section bonding events, etc.
- 2. Help assists Band Captains with social media and DHS band website to remain current and up to date

Lettering in Band

Dunwoody High School Band members who have shown the utmost dedication will have an opportunity to earn an Award Letter in Band. There will be two different sets of criteria-one for winds and percussion and one for auxiliary members. The band letter rewards students for showing a continual commitment to the DHS band program. To earn a letter in band, a student must demonstrate a level of participation, commitment and knowledge "above and beyond" attendance and in class performances.

Participation in the following activities earns points. The student must earn 125 points to be awarded the band letter. For each 125 points earned subsequently, the student will earn a service bar. To receive the DHS Band Letter Award, the student must fill out the form completely, turn in this form to the Band Director by May 1, 2022 and meet the criteria listed below.

Requirements for Letter in Band - Wind and Percussion

No unexcused absences from any rehearsals or performances

Maintained at least a B average in band classes

Earned at least 125 merit points

No debts owed to the Band Program

Requirements for Letter in Band – Auxiliary (Color Guard/Band Manager)

No unexcused absences from any rehearsals or performances

Met fund-raising requirements

Earned at least 50 merit points

No debts owed to the Band Program
